Axolotl (AK-suh-lot-l)


She's kinda finny, like a fish, but also salamanderish.









Bonobo (buh-NOH-boh)

He's quick to say please and quicker to thank you. He won't ever tease, won't ever spank you. He's human-er than some women and men, except for the fact of his hairier skin.








Catamount (KAT-uh-mount)



Echidna (i-KID-nuh)


Echidnas are mammals but they lay eggs. They bumble around on short stubby legs.

I know this all sounds crazy — but it's true! When talking echidnas, would I ekid you?






Fossa (FOS-uh)

The fossa roams 'round Madagascar eating lemurs which are really cute. Don't believe me? You can ask her. She'll say they taste like monkey fruit.



Meet the fish known as gars, they're the stars of their schools. They're so cool they drive cars they just drive in car pools.







Hyrax (HI-rax)


Hyrax are snax for leopards and snakes, so it's hard for them to relax.

Hyrax: Face fax. Life gives and it takes, and everything has its drawbax.










Indri (IN-dree)



Lookdown (LOOK-down)







Naked Mole Rat (NAY-kid MOHL RAT)







If there was an institute for animals considered cute the quokka, a marsupial, would be its foremost pupial.

Still, nothing's better than a quokka, except perhaps a flocka quokka.








Reindeer (REYN-deer)










Tenrec (TEN-rek)

Some creatures like to cuddle and such. Some animals are gentle to touch. Some of them kiss you. But the vinegarroon? Not so much.





Warty Newt (WAHR-tee NOOT)


I wish sometimes I was a newt on days my soul feels destitute. And if I had to pick one part, I would, like newts, regrow my heart.








Xof (ZOF)








Yapok (yuh-POK)

Rocks go in rockets. Locks go in lockets. Docks go in dockets. Socks go in sockets. And baby yapoks go in yapockets.







